



Institut Mittag-Leffler is an international center for research and postdoctoral training in the mathematical sciences

Proposals should contain:

- a description of the intended area of specialization
- motivation why the proposed program is likely to move this area forward
- plans, if any, for the training of junior participants
- a list of suggested invitees, most of whom should have indicated an interest in the program and a willingness to participate for at least one month
- a description of the Nordic connection
- the members of the proposed organizing committee
- one member of the organizing committee designated to serve as contact person

Should your proposal be accepted, then these are the conditions that should be considered

Committee

Each scientific program is led by an organizing committee, usually consisting of 2-4 well-established mathematicians. This committee is expected to:

- have at least one member from a Nordic country
- work closely with the institute in planning the program
- make sure that at least one member of the committee is present at the Institute at all times during the program
- take responsibility for scientific, educational and social activities during the period of the program

Program

- The program is of semester length

Sept- Dec or Jan- Apr, respectively

- Around 25 participants are in residence at any given time
- Participation in the research program is by invitation only
- It is recommended that two or three leading mathematicians will stay for the full semester
- Seminars are conducted one or two afternoons per week. There is an emphasis on free time for research and interaction
- The Institute is housed in a patrician 19th century villa in Djursholm, a suburb of Stockholm
Visitors are accommodated on the premises
